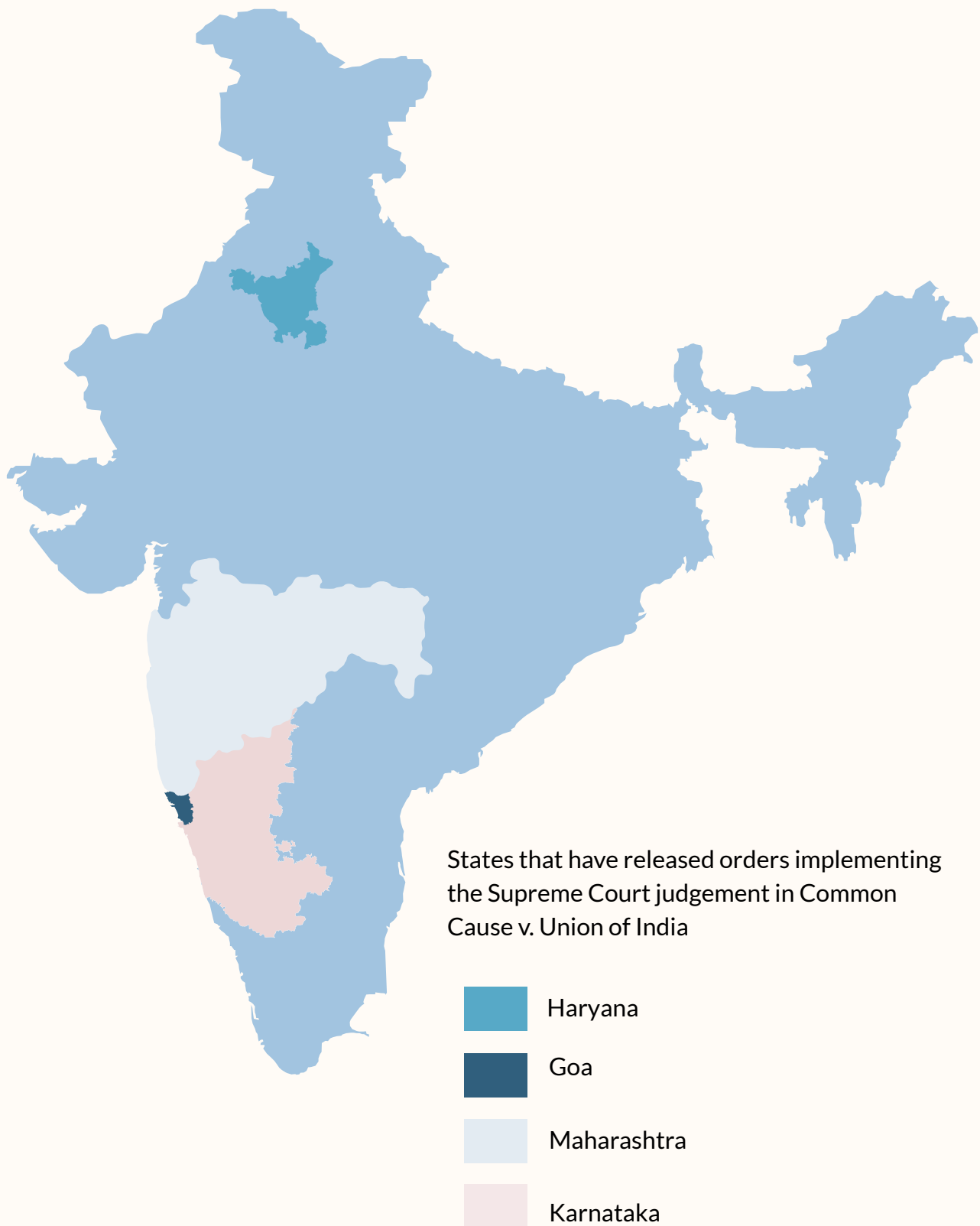

Implementation of orders by states under Common Cause v. Union of India

The Common Cause v. Union of India judgment lays down two key responsibilities for state governments. These include:

1. **Nomination of Doctors to the Secondary Medical Board:** The guidelines detail that the District Chief Medical Officer must appoint a medical professional to the Secondary Medical Board.
2. **Appointment of Custodians:** The state government must appoint one officer of every panchayat, municipal corporation, and municipal council as the custodian of any advance medical directive that they may receive for storage, safekeeping, and validation.
